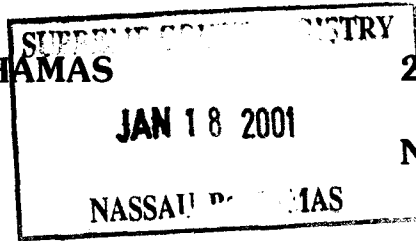

1. That the Plaintiff within seven (7) days after service on them of this Order serve on the crew and the Norwegian Seaman's Union and the International Transport Workers Federation a further and better List of Documents relating to wages, emoluments and repatriation fees of the crew including but not restricted to log books and accounting records and file an affidavit verifying such list.
2. That International Shipping Partners (hereinafter "ISP") within seven (7) days after the service on them of this Order serve on the crew, and the Norwegian Seaman's Union and the International Transport Workers Federation a List of Documents relating to wages, emoluments and repatriation fees of the crew including but not restricted to log books and accounting records and file an affidavit verifying such list.
3. That the Admiralty Marshal within seven (7) days after the service on him of this Order serve on the crew, the Norwegian Seaman's Union and the International Transport Workers Federation a List of Documents relating to wages, emoluments and repatriation fees of the crew including but not restricted to log books and accounting records and file an affidavit verifying such list.
4. That there be an inspection of all documents within seven (7) days of the service of the lists.
5. That the release of the Rembrandt shall be deferred if the respective parties fail to comply with paragraphs 1 to 4 aforementioned.
6. That the costs of this application be cost in the cause.


